Firefighter Jesse Simpson exemplify's what every fire department looks for in their employees on the job, and his actions off duty speak volumes to his tremdous character as well. As a combat veteran Jesse saw first hand the affects that combat can have on his fellow marines. Unfortunately, Simpson's close friend and fellow marine that he had served with committed suicide after being honorably discharged. A suicide that Jesse felt could have easily been prevented, but for lack of reintegration into "normal" society after returning from war.

This all too frequent scenario influenced Simpson to start his own non-profit organization called "Calm, Fit, Complete." The non-profit organization was established with the single goal of capitalizing on the strengths of the men and women of our armed forces returning from combat duty, ensuring a successful transition into the civilian workforce, all while mentoring at risk youth who may have otherwise been overlooked.

During a recent fire department call, Firefighter Simpson's instinctive and public service oriented nature lead him to believe that the condition of the victim he and his engine crew responded to required greater attention than what is considered normal operating procedures.
